I absolutely didn't need one, but it was recommended and better to be safe than sorry. Here's why: An international driver's license is a valid form of ID in 150 countries and translates your driver's license into 10 languages. Even if it is not required from the country you are visiting (here is a handy list), it is much easier to communicate with local authorities when they can read your identification in their native language. The real value of this isn't so much from a legal point of view, but it's in case something was supposed to happen, you're stopped for a traffic violation, or there's an accident, or something goes awry, and you don't have an international driver's permit, (the police) may not be able to communicate effectively with you, Brian Schilling, managing director of travel products and services for AAA, told Cond. Because licenses are issued by individual states, security steps may vary. But the process is smooth once you learn what forms of identification to bring and what tests you need for your license. Provide the paperwork. To apply for a license, you need to visit your local DMV. The first thing they ask for is proof of your identity and place of residence. Take a written test. Drivers of all ages must pass a written test. This is a multi-choice test, but the number and type of questions vary depending on where you live and the type of license you are applying for. For example, in New York, a student's permit test has 20 questions and you have to get 14 correct in order to pass. In Florida, a class D written test consists of 50 questions. Take a driving test. All female learners must schedule and take a driving test - also known as a road test - before their permit expires. Most states require new drivers over the age of 18 to take a road test, too. The test assesses your ability to drive safely and comply with traffic rules. You may be asked to park, drive another car and make a three-way turn, among other moves. If you have a license, you will probably need to purchase car insurance if you are going to be driving regularly. It's legally sanctioned in all states except New Hampshire and Virginia, and almost all states require you to be protected. If you are financing or renting your car, you may have to buy a collision and comprehensive coverage as part of your financial agreement. The cost of car insurance varies depending on your supplier, driver profile, coverage level and location. It is usually cheaper in states like Maine, and is known to be expensive in New Jersey, Minnesota and Georgia.If you have special conditions related to your driving, you may need a limited driver's license. These terms will be listed on your license and you will face a suspension if you are caught breaking them. Restrictions may include: Eyesight. If your vision is impaired, you may be legally required to wear glasses or contacts for driving, or drive only in daylight. Hearing. A Real ID driver's license is a legally driving license in your state that meets the new IDENTIFICATION standards of real ID ACT 2005. In the wake of the 9/11 tragedy, the commission recommended additional measures to improve security in the United States, especially for federal buildings and flights. For drivers this means that your state has a duty to set higher standards for proof of your identity in order to obtain a driver's license. Starting October 1, 2020, in anticipation of additional extensions, you will need a REAL ID or extended driver's license to get on a flight or even pass through airport checkpoints, including for domestic flights. How do I get a REAL ID or an extended driver's license? You can convert your existing license to REAL ID into a local DMV, or you could switch to a real ID online. If additional ID is required, some states allow you to email or provide documents through a secure system. You can watch your DMV's REAL ID section on your website for detailed instructions and online licensing. To get a REAL ID, you need specific documentation and, in some states, a special meeting. For U.S. citizens this list of documents is similar to the previous process in most states, although some require more documents to prove your identity than you could be used for. However, non-citizens must bring documents proving their identity, address, social security number and legal immigration status. Some states add other requirements, such as providing a name change history. Is REAL ID the same as an extended driver's license? No, but extended driver's licenses will qualify for domestic air travel. It also has an added bonus - you can travel to Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean by land or sea with it. The downside is that you must be a resident of Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Vermont or Washington to get an extended driver's license. Although it is quite simple, the steps to obtain a driver's license depend on how old you are, where you live and the type of license Have to. Some states have stricter rules and longer processes than others, so contact your local DMV if you've ever doubted it.
